

Arunachal Pradesh Health and Family Welfare Minister Alo Libang commended the Nocte community of Tirap district for diligently preserving their rich cultural heritage.




ELECTRIC VEHICLE POLICY OF ASSAM



CONTEXT

The assam government has introduced the electric vehicle policy in 2021



ABOUT THE POLICY

- The objectives of the policy are to leverage electric mobility for advancing towards clean transportation, ensuring environmental sustainability and fostering local manufacturing of EV component within the Assam.
- > The implementing authority is the Transport Department of Assam.
- The policy aims to deploy 2 lakh electric vehicles by 2026.

- This involves converting govt. vehicles and public buses to electric along with incentivizing private EV adoption.
- First time EV buyers benefit from substantial discounts, 100% on registration, road tax, parking charges, 50% rebate on toll tax for 5 years.

KEY GAPS IN CURRENT EV POLICY

- The current EV policy lacks provisions for skill development, startup support, and capacity building.
- Subsidies and rebates for EV freight vehicles, both light and heavy, are absent, hampering emissions reduction in commercial transport.
- Integration of Electric Vehicle Charging Infrastructure (EVCI) into the Energy Conservation Building Code (ECBC) is crucial for robust EV charging infrastructure development.

EXAMPLES OF OTHER STATES EV POLICY

- Maharastra has incorporated innovative measures such as emphasizing job creation opportunities and promoting R&D in electric mobility
- Haryana's EV policy focuses on standardizing charging infrastructure and dedicated parking zones
- ➤ Telangana offers benefits like 100% exemption on stamp duty, transfer duty, and registration fees for EV manufacturers.
