- VIKAS (Variable & Immersive Karmayogi Advanced Support): A new blended learning program for the capacity building of middle management civil servants in the Central Secretariat.



Beesa Gaum's role in Indian tea revolution recalled

DOOMDOOMA, Dec 26: he bicentennial anniversay of Singpho chief Beesa aum's first plantation of tea eeds in India was celebratd at the banquet hall of Singho Eco Lodge situated at Inthong in Margherita on Sat-

The programme got under ray with lighting of the cermonial lamp and offering of oral tributes at the portrait f Beesa Gaum by senior scintist of Tocklai Tea Research entre, Jorhat, Dr Pradeep aruah, along with the head f the Department of Anthroology of Rajiv Gandhi Uni-

versity of Arunachal Pradesh. Charit Kumar Chowdhury, a guest from the USA, Branglee Maran, and others. The vice president of Singpho Jatiya Parishad, Gauri Singnen, delivered the welcome ad-

Addressing the gathering, Asom Gaurav awardee entrepreneur Manie La of Margherita said that although history gives credit to Robert Bruce for the discovery of tea plants in Assam, Singpho chief Beesa Gaum and Ningrula also deserve the same credit. If Bruce had not met Beesa Gaum, then it would not have been possible for the

flourish like it does today, he said. It is due to the contribution of those Singpho leaders that the Assam tea has gained popularity across the globe, Manje La added.

"The Singphos not only collected tea leaves from the jungles, but also planted tea plants in their own kitchen gardens to produce tea in an indigenous way for their own consumption, long before the British opened tea gardens in Assam. The Singphos used to pluck the 'phalap numfang' or the newly sprouted tea leaves, and dry them in the sunshine. Then, they used to put those dried tea

tea industry of Assam to leaves in bamboo pipes and keep them near the hearth. The tea leaves thus kept can be conserved for six to seven years without losing their quality." Manie La said.

He further said: "The history of tea in Assam begins with the enterprising Ningru chief (Duwa) who laid the foundation for trading tea from the Ledo and Margherita regions. In 1840, the first batch of 95 tea boxes was dispatched to the Calcutta market for sale. Out of these 95 boxes, 35 were prepared and packed by Ningrula himself. He earned a profit of 480 British pounds from those 35 tea boxes, writing the first commercial chapter of Assam tea." Addressing the gathering,

Dr Pradeep Baruah illustrated different varieties of tea available in the world with still photographs. On the other hand, Charit Kumar Chowdhury urged the Singpho community to set up a village museum at Ledo with the assimilation of Singpho tea and Singpho culture.

The organisers felicitated Beesa Nang Singpho, the great-grandson of Beesa Gaum; Wanglin Mungsang, professor in the Department of Tribal Affairs of Rajiv Gandhi University of Arunachal Pradesh; PB Baruah, general manager of AGCL, Duliaian; Sukanta Manlai, assistant general manager of AGCL, Duliajan; and several other distinguished persons in the programme.

At the beginning of the programme, a group of Singpho girls presented a chorus. The entire programme was moderated by retired principal of Tinsukia College Rana Kumar Changmai. Among others, the programme was also attended by the subdivisional agricultural officer of Margherita, Binav Deka, tea planter Raiesh Singpho, and the secretary general of SDS of Arunachal Pradesh, Angvun Maio.

SINGPHO TEA PRACTICES

The Singphos had been collecting and planting tea leaves in their kitchen gardens, using indigenous methods for production and conservation, long before the British established tea gardens in Assam.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE

The first commercial chapter of Assam tea was written by Ningru chief Duwa, who laid the foundation for tea trading from the Ledo and Margherita regions in 1840.
