The Ahoms led by Lachit Borphukan handed the Mughals a crushing defeat in Battle of Saraighat which was fought on the waters of the Brahmaputra in 1671 and thwarted their expansionist designs in this part of today's India. Incidentally, the land of the existing portion of the rampart belongs to Gauhati University but neither the GU authorities nor the government seems much perturbed over the ongoing encroachment.


ABOUT

INDIA-UAE RELATIONS

- India has recently made its first-ever rupee payment for the purchase of crude oil from the United Arab Emirates (UAE).
- Indian Oil Corp (IOC) made a payment to Abu Dhabi National Oil Company (ADNOC) in Indian rupees, following an agreement between the two countries during Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to the UAE.



- This transaction is significant as it allows India to cut transaction costs by eliminating dollar conversions and boosts its efforts to settle bilateral trade in rupees instead of dollars.
- The bilateral trade between India and the UAE was \$84.5 billion in 2022/23, and India is keen to push similar local currency arrangements with other countries to boost exports amid slowing global trade.

SAVITRIBAI PHULE

Savitribai Phule was a prominent figure in Indian history, known for her contributions to education and social reform.

She was one of the first female teachers in India and a pioneer of women's rights.

Born on January 3, 1831, in the state of Maharashtra, she played a vital role in promoting education for girls and in addressing gender and caste discrimination.



CONTRIBUTIONS TO INDIAN SOCIETY

Pioneering women's education:

• She founded the first school for girls in Pune in 1848, breaking social norms and paving the way for women's education in India.

 She went on to establish 17 more schools for girls.




- Fighting against caste discrimination:

 She wrote powerful poems that highlighted the issues of gender and caste discrimination.



RANI VELU NACHIYAR

Rani Velu Nachiyar was the first queen to fight against the British colonial power in India.

She was born in 1730 in Ramanathapuram, Tamil Nadu, India and was trained in many methods of combat, including war match weapons usage, martial arts like Valari, Silambam, horse riding, and archery.

She was a scholar in many languages and was proficient in languages like French, English, and Urdu.
